

### DETAILED CONDITIONS FOR AWARDING THE RECTOR'S SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS

- I. Points for academic achievements are awarded according to the table below:  
**EACH SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENT (attached to the application) MUST INCLUDE, IN ADDITION TO THE CONFIRMATION, the description of the student: (author's name, date and place, achievement CODE, attachment number – according to the attachment on the application)**

1. Points for individual scientific achievements are summed up.
2. Submitting the application is equivalent to signing the data compliance statement. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
3. If the presented achievement is not taken into account by the committee, the student receives "0 points".
4. In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee does not award the points.
5. Only published works (publications) are considered.
6. In a given academic year, only two popular science articles and active participation in only two university conferences may be included, regardless of the language in which the articles were published and the papers delivered. A popular science article is a publication in non-reviewed or online journals, and in periodicals / journals of student research groups. A university conference is an event organised at the University of Lodz or by a unit of the University of Lodz.
7. An active participation in the conference is considered to be a presentation of a paper or presentation of a poster. Points for active participation in a given conference are only awarded once, regardless of the number of lectures or posters presented.
8. A given scientific achievement is scored only 1 TIME in the case of presenting the same paper at many conferences, the highest number of points is taken into account (type of conference).

**II. Points for artistic achievements are awarded according to the table below:**

1. Points for individual artistic achievements are summed up.
2. Submitting the application is equivalent to signing the data compliance statement. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
3. If the presented achievement is not taken into account by the committee, the student receives "0 points".
4. In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee does not award the points.
5. The field of art includes: literature, music, dance, theatre, cinematography, care for monuments, folk art, visual arts (photography, painting, sculpture, graphics), and applied arts.
6. The publication of a work is considered to be: a book, a volume, an album, a film, or a play.
7. Artistic activities related to art, such as concerts, exhibitions, film screenings and performing administrative or managerial functions at such events, are not considered artistic achievements.
8. A university conference/festival/review/university Olympics is considered to be organised at the University of Lodz, national - an event organised by a Polish centre other than the University of Lodz, and international events are considered to be events organised by foreign centres.
9. Only one achievement of a given rank should be included in the application. If, for example, a student has participated in two national art competitions, only the higher-ranked event is taken into account. Points for several artistic achievements of a given rank are not added up.

**Points for sports achievements are awarded according to the following table:**

1. Points for individual sports achievements are summed up.
2. Submitting the application is equivalent to signing the data compliance statement. Providing false information is subject to disciplinary and criminal liability.
3. If the presented achievement is not taken into account by the committee, the student receives "0 points".
4. In the absence of a document confirming the achievements indicated by the student, the committee does not award the points.
5. In individual sports, in the field *taken place*, enter the place taken in the individual classification. The place taken by the team is not considered (it does not apply to team disciplines, games).
6. Only one achievement of a given rank should be included in the application. If, for example, a player took part in the Polish academic volleyball championships and the Polish youth championships organised by the Polish Volleyball Federation, only the event or competition in which they were placed higher is taken into account. Points for several sports achievements of a given rank are not added up.
7. In the case of having a sports class, it is necessary to attach its confirmation issued by the Polish sports association included in the current announcement of the minister responsible for physical education. The lack of the certificate is equivalent to not considering the points for the sports class.

**III. Points for average grade are awarded according to the following rules:**

1. Scholarship points are awarded to students who achieved a high average for the previous academic year.
2. Points for high average grade are awarded on the basis of the mean: multiplied by a factor of 10.

$$\text{points} = \text{mean} * 10$$
